Abstract of the Will of Griffith William of Is-law'r ffordd in the Parish of Llanddwywe in the County of Merioneth, Yeoman, written 7 Feb 1744/5, proved 7 Nov 1750.

Gives and devises all his messuages, tenements, lands and hereditaments in the parish of Llanddwywe and elsewhere in the county of Merioneth to his neighbours and friends Evan Vaughan of Cors-y-Gedol, Esquire, and Humphrey Owen of Llandanwg, Gentleman, to hold for a term of twenty years in Trust to raise the sum of £100 in order to cover his debts, the surplus thereof to be placed out at interest in good securities for the use and benefit of **his son William Griffith by Sarah his present wife**, to be paid to him once he attains the age of twenty-one years. On further Trust he directs the said Evan Vaughan and Humphrey Owen to raise an additional £50 out of the devised premises and to pay the same to **his five youngest daughters by his first wife**, share and share alike.

If **his eldest son Robert Griffith** will pay the said sums of £100 and £50 to the said Evan Vaughan and Humphrey Owen for the uses abovementioned, then the term of twenty years shall cease and upon that condition he gives and devises his said messuages, tenements, lands and hereditaments to his said son Robert Griffith his heirs and assigns forever.

All the rest and residue of his goods, cattle, chattels, rights, credits and personal estate he gives and bequeaths to his said wife Sarah and his said son William whom he nominates, constitutes and appoints co-Executors of his last will and testament.
