Abstract of the Will of John Richards of Tyddyn bach in the Parish of Llanenddwyn in the County of Merioneth, written 21 Jan 1847, proved 16 Dec 1847.

Gives and bequeaths to **his sons Richard and Rees** the sum of thirty pounds to be equally divided between them, to be paid to them or to the survivor of them by his executrix within four years after his death.

The rest and residue of his personal estate he gives and bequeaths to **his wife Margaret** whom he nominates, constitutes and appoints sole Executrix of his last will and testament, provided she does not marry. But in case she does marry then his will is that she will receive the sum of twenty pounds out of his personal estate and that the remainder of his property is then to be divided equally between his children by his said wife Margaret.
