Abstract of the Will of Elizabeth Tarrant of Lamborne in the County of Berks, Widow, written 30 Oct 1737, proved 8 Jul 1738.

Gives £20 to her grandson William Tarrant son of William Tarrant, to be paid to him when he reaches the age of twenty-one years. She also gives to her said grandson the featherbed he sleeps on, along with its bedstead, a pair of sheets, one pair of blankets, and a coverlet.

Gives to her granddaughter Elizabeth Tarrant daughter of the said William Tarrant all the furniture in the testator's bedroom, along with the bed and bedding.

Gives £5 to her son Francis Tarrant.

Gives 5 shillings each to her grandsons and granddaughters John, Charles, and William Gilmar, John & William Tarrant sons of John Tarrant, Charles Tarrant son of Charles Tarrant, Mary & Elizabeth Hiscock.

Gives 5 shillings each to her son-in-law John Gilmar and her daughter-in-law [blank] Tarrant, widow of her son William Tarrant.

Gives to **her son-in-law James Hiscock** her messuage or tenement and the premises called George Inn with six-and-a-half acres of arable and pasture land in the parish of Lamborne, for the period of two years conditional to the lease from the Right Honourable William Lord Craven continuing. At the end of the two years she gives the same to **her son John Tarrant** for the remainder of the lease.

All the rest, residue and remainder of her estate and effects both real and personal she gives and bequeaths to her said son-in-law James Hiscock whom she appoints sole executor of her last will and testament.
