Gives and bequeaths £5 to his grandson John, the son of his said daughter Alice.

All the rest and residue of his goods, cattle, chattels, farm stock, implements of husbandry, and personal estate he gives and bequeaths to his son William Evans and his friends Richard James of Lletty Willym and Robert Owen of Havod Ysputty in Trust for his grandchildren Elizabeth, Jane and Ellinor Evans, daughters of his said son William Evans, and Ellinor, Jane, Elizabeth, Alice, Owen and William Evans, children of his daughter Ellinor the wife of Evan Owen and John William the son of his said daughter Alice the wife of William Jones, share and share alike.

Nominates, constitutes and appoints his said son William Evans and his friends Richard James and Robert Owen executors of his last will and testament, giving to his said son William Evans two guineas and the two other Trustees one guinea each.
