

Probate records of the Consistory Court of Salisbury, P1/1826/133

Abstract of the Will of Hester Hunt of Hillmarton in the County of Wilts, Widow, written 22 Jul 1826, proved 17 Oct 1826.

Gives £50 to **her son Joseph Hunt**.

Gives £60 to **her son John Hunt**.

Gives £5 to **her son Jesse Hunt** as he already possesses the whole of his late father's property.

Gives £60 to **her daughter Patience Taylor (wife of William Taylor of Hillmarton, victualler)**, as well as all her linen and wearing apparel.

Gives £25 each to **her grandchildren Abel Neale and Mary Neale**.

All the rest and residue of her estate and effects she gives to **her eldest son Jonas Hunt**, whom she appoints sole executor of her last will.

Hester Hunt of Hillmarton, widow of the late Joseph Hunt, was buried in Hillmarton on 28 Sep 1826, aged 73 years (b.c. 1753). Hester Hopkins was christened in Hillmarton on 22 Apr 1753, daughter of John Hopkins and Mary White.

Joseph Hunt married Hester Hopkins in Hillmarton on 31 Oct 1774.
