Abstract of the Will of Humphry Harvy of the Parish of Crowan in the County of Cornwall, Miller, written 6 Feb 1760, proved 12 May 1760.

Gives to **his wife** all his effects in Tremean in Crowan, as well as an annuity of 40 shillings out of his estate in Releigh and an annuity of 40 shillings out of his estate (in) Well-nusen.

Gives 5 shillings to his son Ralph Harvey.

Gives to **his son William Harvey** his estate in Carvolth, as of four years hence, along with a third part of the Bottoms in a tin mine in Tremenhere.

Gives to **his daughter Mary Holmon** an annuity of £4 after the death of **her mother Susannah Harvey**, as well as 5 shillings in cash and a third part of the Bottom in a tin mine in Tremenhere.

All the rest of his real and personal estate he gives to **his son Humphry Harvey** whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.

Humphry Harvey was christened 19 Nov 1710 in Crowan, son of Ralfe Harvey. He married Susanna Swalwell in Crowan on 31 Jul 1731. Humphry was buried in the same parish on 13 Mar 1760.
