Abstract of The Will of Anthony Norman of St. Andrews, written 16 Oct 1665, proved 6 Oct 1681.

- Recommends his body to be buried in the parish Church of St. Andrews
- Gives and bequeaths one shilling for forgotten tithes
- Gives and bequeaths to his niece Margaret Willy one cow and a couple of ewes
- Gives and bequeaths to his wedded **wife Mary David** his dwelling house in The Bove Hill, with the barns, ox house, garden, two orchards, and all his lands, arable, meadow, wood and pasture, for the term of sixteen years. And if she live after the expiration of the said sixteen years, and bequeath to **his son and heir John Norman**, then his widow Mary David will retain one half of the said bequest. If she dies before the expiration of the sixteen years, then the whole of the lands etc to be charged at twenty pounds yearly for the maintenance of his son and heir John Norman
- Bequeaths to his three daughters Elizabeth, Susanna and Mary by equal portions [part of the above charge on the lands]. Wills that if his son and heir John Norman should die without lawful issue then the said lands and premises will pass to his daughter Elizabeth and her heirs after her decease; and if Elizabeth has no lawful heirs, then to Susan his second daughter and to her lawful heirs; and if Susan has no lawful heirs, then to Mary Norman his youngest daughter and her lawful heirs.
- Bequeaths the rest of his goods and chattels to his wife Mary David.
- Appoints his son John Norman to be the sole executor of his last will and testament
