Gives and bequeaths 2 shillings to the said William Owen & Jonett his wife.

Gives and bequeaths £5 to Ann Ellis, Gwen Ellis, Jane Ellis and John Isaac, children of his son-in-law Ellis Isaac & Margarett his wife, to be equally divided among them.

Gives and bequeaths 2 shillings to the said Ellis Isaac and Margaret his wife.

Gives and bequeaths 1 shilling to his son Owen Roderick.

Gives and bequeaths £5 to his grandchildren Valentine Owen and William Owen, sons of his said son Owen Roderick.

Gives and bequeaths 40 shillings to his daughter Jane Owen.

Gives and bequeaths £3 to Owen John son of his said son John Owen.

Nominates, constitutes and appoints **his wife Ann Owen** sole Executrix of his last will and testament, and to whom he gives and bequeaths all the rest and residue of his personal estate.
