Bequeaths to **his son Hugh Hunter Hughes** all his surgical instruments, the bottles and medicines and a portion of his books marked for him in a list headed "A list of books to be distributed after Thomas Hughes's decease."

Wills and bequeaths to his said son Hugh Hunter Hughes all his messuages and tenements situated in or near the village of Moch dre in the Parish of Llandrillo in the County of Denbigh commonly called Ty ------ and Llainfain, Ty coch, Tynewydd, the shop and warehouse opposite . . . . . . and his moiety or a part enclosed . . . . . . . . and adjoining the respective . . . . . to him and his heirs forever, subject to the payment of £310 as follows:

- £60 to his son Thomas Hughes
- £50 to his daughter Ellen
- £50 to his daughter Elizabeth
- £50 to his daughter Gwen Maria
- £50 to his daughter Sarah
- £50 to his daughter Mary

The interest of  $4\frac{1}{2}$ % per annum from the above sum of £310 to be paid to his wife after his decease.

Wills and desires that his landed property in the town of Pwllheli called Plas y Ward . . . . . to his wife.

Nominates and appoints his wife sole Executrix of his last will and testament.

Requests that his friend M<sup>r</sup>. William Thomas, architect, assist his wife in disposing of property.
