*Abstract of the Will of John Arundell of the Parish of Phillack in the County of Cornwall, written 25 Sep 1618, proved 5 Feb 1628/9.*

Gives to **his son John Arundell** £180, three silver spoons and a gold ring.

Gives to **his daughter Alce Arundell** £180, three silver spoons, his wedding ring and his wife's chest.

Gives to **his son Christopher Arundell** his tenements in Phillack called Carwyn Kayle and Kayle Vean along with their deeds and leases.

Gives to William Glason 6 shillings 8 pence.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor man's box in the parish of Camborne.

Gives 10 shillings to rector Mr. George Phillipps for tithes forgotten.

Gives 10 shillings to **his godson William Phillipps**.

Gives 10 shillings to **his godson John Rowe**.

All the rest of his goods & chattels he gives to **his son Christopher Arundell**, appointing him sole executor of his will.

Nominates as overseers of his last will and testament Mr. Gregory Phillipps, rector, and **Richard Pendarves**, gent.
