Abstract of the Will of Thomas Banbury of the Parish of Launcells in the County of Cornwall, written 30 May 1798, proved 1 Mar 1804.

Gives to **his wife** for life £4 a year out of his estate called Barrow in the parish of Bridgerule, as well as £4 a year out of his estates called Scorsham and Woodhouse in the parish of Launcells. He also gives her the best bed and the household furniture in the house at Scorsham.

Gives to his daughter Grace Cory £2 a year.

Gives to **his son Charles Banbury** a tenement called Batsbur Park in the parish of Launcells.

Gives to his two sons Charles Banbury and Samuel Banbury two tenements called Partridges and Pooleys in the village of Tinney in the parish of Bridgerule in co. Devon, in trust for his son Thomas Banbury.

Gives to **his son Samuel Banbury** his estate called Barrow in the parish of Bridgerule, paying the aforesaid annuity to his (Samuel's) mother.

Gives to his daughters Joan Hicks\* and Alice Lyle one guinea each.

All the rest of his goods and chattels, monies, and security for money, he gives, devises and bequeaths to **his son Richard Banbury** whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.
