Gives 40 shillings to the poor of the parish of Kea.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor of the parish of Feock.

Gives 10 shillings to the poor of the parish of Gwennap.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor of the parish of Stithians.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor of the parish of Camborne.

Gives to **his wife** £5, his best gelding or mare, his best cow, his best feather bed, and her gold & jewels.

Gives to **his daughter Thomazin** £350 and all his interest in a tenement in the parish of Wendron which he holds by lease of John Vivian of St. Columb Major.

Gives £5 to Hugh Bawden his brother's son.

Gives £50 to his granddaughter Elizabeth the daughter of John Beauchamp.

Gives 40 shillings each to the rest of his grandchildren.

Gives to his house servants 5 shillings each.

Gives his cloak to Joseph Martyn.

Gives 20 shillings to his daughter-in-law to buy herself a ring.

All the rest of his goods & chattels he gives to **his son Reynold Bawden** whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.
