The Nuncupative Will of Edward Bennett of the Parish of Camborne in the County of Cornwall, written 28 April 1674, proved 28 Sep 1674.

(The writing is in parts illegible, particularly toward the end; paragraphed.)

In the name of God Amen. Edward Bennett of the parish of Camborne, being sicke & weake of body butt of perfect mind & memory did make & declare his last nuncupative will and Testament In manner & forme following on the 28th day of Aprill AD 1674 he declared **Avis his wife** an aged & weake woman she should have all his right & 5th part mill & he also gave her all his right He likewise gave her one Cow, one heifer, at 2 years old & one & 8 sheepe & 3 Lambs, 1 pigg, 2 goats, & one kidd, & his bedd

It. He gave unto **his son Anthony** all his household goods, one Cow & 2 piggs, & his will was that his other sons should each of them have 12d apiece.
