

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers, PROB 11/1654/271.

Abstract of the Will of James Bull of the Parish of Falmouth in the County of Cornwall, Esquire, written 27 Jul 1812, proved 14 Mar 1822.

Gives to **his son John Bull** his gold watch, chain and seal, and also his silver-mounted pistols.

Gives £5,000 to **his son James Bull**, part of his capital stock in the Navy five per centum bank annuities. Also gives to his son James his leasehold property currently occupied by Mr. James Wynn, innkeeper.

All the rest of his stock funds, monies, goods, chattels, credits, estates and effects, he gives to **his daughter Polly Bull**, appointing her sole executrix of his last will and testament.

Polly Bull, spinster, died in 1825 leaving his will unadministered. Prior to her death she made her will and appointed William Lake, John Carne the Elder, and William Carne, esquires, executors and residuary legatees, in trust, of her father's legacies.
