

Abstract of the Will of John Burlace of Pendeen in the Parish of St. Just-in-Penwith and County of Cornwall, Gentleman, written 24 Jul 1663, proved 20 Jul 1665.

(Document only partially legible due to extensive fading.)

Gives to **his wife Chesten [Burlace]** one hundred and fifty pounds.

Gives to **his son Walter Burlace** his tenement called Pe-----gan

Gives to **his son William [Burlace]** his tenement called Tolcarne within the parish of

Gives to **his son George [Burlace]** the sum of [one] hundred pounds.

Gives to his

Gives to **his daughter Anne Burlace** one hundred pounds.

Gives to **his daughter [Margery] Burlace** [two] hundred pounds.

Gives to his

Gives to his godchildren shillings each.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his son John Burlace** whom he appoints sole executor of his will.

Nominates his friends Hugh Jones and Hugh Pauley Gent. as overseers

An inventory of the goods and chattels of Pendeen in the county of Cornwall, Gent, deceased, was appraised by Hugh Pawley and Emmmanuel Millett, Gent on 30 May 1664. Sum-total £1938 3s. 4d.
