Abstract of the Will of William Chiverton of the Parish of Paul in the County of Cornwall, Gentleman, written 31 Oct 1627, proved 19 May 1629.

Gives 40 shillings to the poor of the parish of Paul, to be divided between Newlyn, Mousehole and the land.

Gives to the Church of Paul £3 13s. 4d.

Gives to Nicholas Hicks all his books and lawbooks.

Gives 40 shillings to his cousin John Arundell.

Gives 40 shillings to his cousin Besse Grosse.

Gives £4 to **his cousin William Trewren**, as well as his house and garden in Helston.

Gives to **Walter Burlace** his court in Mousehole, and to **Walter's brother**, **John Burlace**, he gives his tinworks and 40 shillings.

Gives £20 to William Burlace of Sithney.

Gives to his daughter-in-law Dorothy Keigwin, the wife of John Keigwin, his houses and gardens in Mousehole.

Gives 40 shillings each to his godchildren Godolphin, Saint-Aubyn, Fleminge and Chiverton.

Gives to **his cousin William Arundell** a moiety or half share of his lands and tenements, and the other half to **Thomas Trewren the younger**, **son of Thomas Trewren** of Sancres (Sancreed?).

Gives 5 shillings each to his servants besides their wages.

Forgives a debt of £6 owed to him by Thomas Tonken.

Gives 40 shillings to his servant John Trewren, as well as a suit of clothes.

Gives to John Tanner a cow.

Gives 40 shillings to his godson Ezechiell Trewren and his riding horse.

Gives to Ann Aubaron of Tresvenacke his land in Trevean in the parish of Peran.

The rest of his goods & chattels he gives to his daughter-in-law Phillipp Hicks the wife of Nicholas Hicks, appointing her sole executrix of his last will and testament.

Nominates his kinsmen Nicholas Godolphin and Richard Keigwin overseers of his will.
