

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers,
PROB 11/1245/184.

Abstract of the Will of Ann Cloak of the Town of Penzance in the County of Cornwall, Widow, written 2 Mar 1794, proved 17 May 1794.

Gives £50 to **her sister M^{rs}. Warner**.

Gives £50 to **Margaret the daughter of the Reverend James Parkin** of Oakford in the county of Devon. Also gives Margaret her printed gauze gown and petticoat.

Gives 10 guineas to **her nephew John Michell**.

Gives 10 guineas to her friend Jane Sampson wife of Mr. Henry Sampson of Penzance, watchmaker.

All the rest of her goods and chattels, lands and tenements, she gives to Richard Oxnam of Penzance, merchant, and the aforesaid Henry Sampson, to hold in trust for the benefit of **her nieces Mary Michell and Margaret Michell**, share and share alike, once they turn twenty-one.

Appoints the said Richard Oxnam and Henry Sampson executors in trust of her last will and testament.
