

Kresen Kernow (formerly Cornwall Record Office), Reference: AP/C/5196 W.

Abstract of the Will of William Cock of the Parish of Camborne in the County of Cornwall, Miller, written 11 Feb 1840, proved 7 May 1841.

Gives to **his wife Betsy Cock** all his goods, property and chattels for life, except for £50 which he will pay to **his daughter Mary Tyack**.

Gives an annuity of £6 to **his daughter Nanny Vivian, wife of Capt. Joseph Vivian**, along with that part of Reskajage rented by Richard Hocking of Gwithian.

Gives to **his daughter Mary Tyack, wife of William Tyack**, innkeeper, his messuages, lands and premises in Nanterrow in the parish of Gwithian.

Gives to **his daughter Jane Symons, wife of William Symons**, sadler, his two fields in Camborne, Jane Symons paying to his daughter Nanny Vivian the said sum of £6 per annum.

Following the death of his wife, he gives £5 each to **his four daughters Betsy Rosewarne, wife of John Rosewarne**, farmer, and the aforesaid **Nanny Vivian, Mary Tyack and Jane Symons**.

All the rest of his estate, goods, chattels &c. he gives to the said Joseph Vivian and W^m Symons, in trust, for the benefit of his wife during her natural life, and after her death, in trust, to be divided between his four daughters, share and share alike.

Appoints the said Joseph Vivian and William Symons executors in trust of his last will and testament.
