In the name of god amen

I William Cocke of the p'ish of Gwythian in the Countye of Cornewall Husbandman being aged and in my sicknes but but in my perfitt Remembrance thankes be unto almightye god, doe att this present tyme voyd all former wills legacies & gifts and make this my last will and testament in manner & forme following

Imprimis I doe bequeathe my soule into the hands of Almighty god beseechin[g] for his infinite goodness and mercye for his deare sonne Christ Jesus . . . . . . my onely Saviour and Redeemer and my bodye to Christian Buriall in hope of a ioyefull . . . . . .

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I doe give to the poore of the p'ish of Gwythian five shillings:

Item I doe give for tithes for gotten five shillings:

Item I doe give unto **Marye my Wife** and unto **H[enrye] Cock** my Sonn whome I doe make my whole executors all my goods movea[ble] and unmoveable, and doe desire them to live in love as formerly they . . . . . . they molest not or defraud one another.

Item I doe give unto **my Daughter Jane** six pounds which I promised her att her betrothing

Item I give unto **my Daughter Cheston** & the Rest of my Children hereafter name[d] . . . . **my sonn Bennett** theise p'cells of land of Cocks Tenement to be sett to there yerely P'fitt And to Inioye it during the time & terme of Eaighte yeares :

Imprimis I doe give and bequeath the first yeares P'fitt of p'ke annines? p'ke gwarra kineanvethen pke Noweth and the Rent at Cocks houses except the house that Maud Cocke lived in : I give and bequeath the first yeares P'fitt to **my daughter**Cheston

Item I give the seacond yeares P'fitt to my sonn Rogger:

Item I give the third yeres P'fitt unto my daughter Counstance :

Item I give the fourth yeares Profitt unto my daughter Gra[ce]

Item I give and bequeath the fifte yeares P'fitt unto my sonne Anthonye:

Item I give and bequeath the sixt yeares P'fitt unto my sonn James:

Item I doe give and bequeath the seaventh yeares P'fitt unto my sonn Charles:

Item I doe give and bequeath unto **my daughter Sara** which is **maried to Robert Diggorye** twelfe pence

Item I doe give to my Grand Child James Diggorye twelfe pence

Item I doe give unto my daughter Sara her two daughters two shillings

Item I doe give unto my daughter Jane her Child twelfe pence

Item I doe give & bequeath unto **Marye my wife** & **Henrye Cock my Sonne** Both which . . . . . . my full & whole executors excepting & Reserving the estate of Cocks Tenement after the death of my sonne Henrye that **my sonne Bennett** shall inioye according to true intent & meaning.

And I doe intreate my welbeloved Frinds and Neighbours John Andrewartha & William Stephens to be my overseers to doe Best indeavors that this my will maye Be p'formed.

And here unto I have sett my signe & seale even the 12th daye of November in Anno Domini 1644.
