

Abstract of the Will of Robert Cornow of the Parish of Towednack in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 8 Mar 1684/5, proved 25 Nov 1685.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor of the parish of Towednack.

Gives to **his son Robert Cornow** a mare, a metal crock, a metal pan and board.

Gives to **his son Michael Cornow** the strawberry mare and the black mare colt, a pan called Roswall pan, and a crock called Roswall crock.

Gives £40 to **his son David Cornow**.

Gives £40 to **his son William Cornow**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives £40 to **his son Richard Cornow**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives £40 to **his daughter Jane Cornow**, to be paid to her when she turns eighteen.

Gives 1 shilling each to his godchildren.

Gives to **his son Peter Cornow** a tenement called Terean Rose Amall, and a moiety of a tenement in Embla.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his wife Catern Cornow** and to **his son Peter Curnow**, appointing them co-executors of his last will and testament.
