In the name of God Amen: I William Crase of the parishe of Logan in the countie of Cornwall Tynner beinge sicke of bodie but whole of memorie and mynde praise be to God doe make this my last will and Testament in manner and forme followinge First I doe geive and bequeathe my Soule into the Handes of Almightie God my maker and redeemer and my bodie to be buried in the said parishe churche of Logan.

I doe geive to **Agnes Crase my daughter** one yeowe, and one platter.

I doe geive to Elizabethe Crase my daughter one yeowe, and one platter.

All the reste of my goodes and Chattells moveabell and unmoveabell my debtes and Legacies paied and not geiven, nor bequeathed I doe geive and bequeathe unto Jane Crase my wife to Parkinge Crase and unto Henrie Crase my sonnes whom I doe make my full and whole executors to se this my laste will and Testament fulfilled and performed. In witnesse whereof, I Robert Hockinge of the said parishe of Logan and in the said countie tynner and Margaret Skynner of the said parishe Spinster have hereunto put our Signes the seventh Daie of June in the eightenthe yere of the raigne of our Soveraigne Lord James by the grace of God kinge of England Scotland France and Ireland defender of The faithe and in the yere of Lord Christ 1620.
