Abstract of the Will of Margerie Creegoe (of the Parish of St. Just in Roseland), written 18 Feb 1649/50, proved 4 Dec 1658.

Gives 20 shillings to the poor of the parish of St. Just.

Gives to her sister Marie Tynnie her best coat which was her mother's coat.

Gives to her sister Margaret John her best neckcloth and her best apron.

Gives to her cousin Marie Tynnie a little napkin.

Gives a coat to her sister Pascas Luke.

Gives to her sister Joane Thomas four napkins.

Gives to her sister Ann John a black silk girdle and a purse with tassels.

Gives 40 shillings to her cousin Marie Tynnie.

Gives to her servant Marie Greene a red coat with three threaded laces, a green waistcoat, a square and a smock.

Gives her wedding smock to her sister Marie Tynnie.

Gives a linen smock to Marie Michell.

Gives a blue apron to Elizabeth Greet, and one neckcloth.

Gives to John Dingle her husband's best suit of clothes.

Gives to Marie Dingle a red coat with two laces, her Sunday waistcoat and a canvas smock.

Gives to Christopher Clemens a pair of medley breeches, a pair of shoes and a pair of stockings.

Gives to Thomas Rowe a pair of grey breeches.

Gives to Christopher Grubb a grey jerkin.

Gives the portion her husband gave her between her three sons, except that **her son John** shall have £20 more than the **other two sons**, **Stephen** receiving £5 more than **Walter**.

Gives to **her son Walter Creegoe** her right in Robert Tysicke House, appointing him sole executor of her last will and testament.

Nominates her brother Thomas Hewgoe and Stephen John and William Tynny as overseers during the minority of her children.
