Gives to his daughter Mary Roberts and her children a guinea for life.

Gives to his daughter Ann Curnow and her children one guinea for life.

Gives £60 to his daughter Katherine Curnow.

All the rest of his goods and chattels, money, bills & bonds, he gives to **his son Peter Curnow**, appointing him sole executor of his last will and testament.
