The Will of Constance Fine of the Parish of Camborne in the County of Cornwall, Widow, written 25 May 1802, proved 17 Aug 1802.

I will and direct that my just debts and funeral Expences be fully paid and satisfied by my Executor hereafter named by Sale or otherwise as he shall think proper.

I give and bequeath unto my Son [blank] One shilling to be paid him by my Executor within one week after my Death.

I give and bequeath unto William Paull of Pendarves in Cornwall Gentleman All the rest residue and remainder of my Goods Chattles Credits and Effects whatsoever To hold to the said William Paull his Executors Administrators and Assigns In Trust, after payment of my Debts, Legacies and funeral Expences to permit and suffer **my Daughter Elizabeth Blewett Wife of Richard Blewett** to have receive and enjoy the rents and profits of the produce (after payment as aforesaid) of my Effects, to her sole and separate use, and without the controul of her Husband during her life and her receipt shall be as sufficient discharge to my Executor, and from and after her death then to pay the same to such of the Children of my said Daughter Elizabeth Blewett as shall be then living, in equal proportions until the youngest that shall be living shall attain his or her age of twenty one years, and from thence to divide the produce aforesaid amongst such Children as shall be living in equal proportions, but in case all the Children shall die in the life time of my said Daughter, then my Executor is to pay over the produce aforesaid to Andrew Rogers of Penryn for his sole use and benefit.

And I do hereby nominate and appoint the said William Paull Executor of this my last Will and Testament revoking all former Wills by me at any time heretofore made. And I desire that my Executor will reimburse himself such Expences as he may be put to by reason of this trust. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and two.

Signed Sealed and Delivered published and declared as and for the last Will and Testament of Constance Fine in Presence of us who at her request and in her Presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as Witnesses hereto.
