Abstract of the Will of Martin Harvey of the Parish of Crowan in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 19 Jan 1821, proved 11 Jun 1828.

Gives £500 to **his wife Wilmot Harvey**, as well as all his household goods and furniture; his estate and interest in the tenement of Trethingey in the parish of Phillack; his share, estate and interest in the tenement called Bodaverran in the parish of St. Erth; and his leasehold dwelling house and garden in Praze in the parish of Crowan which he now occupies.

After the death or remarriage of his wife, he gives his dwelling house &c in Praze to his daughter Wilmot Harvey. After her decease or marriage, he gives the same to his four daughters, Elizabeth the wife of Hannibal Cardell, Alice wife of Joseph Cardell, the said Wilmot Harvey, and Mary the wife of John Davey.

Gives to his son William Harvey, to his son-in-law the said John Davey, and to his daughter, the said Wilmot Harvey, the said amount of £500, in trust, to invest in some government or other security, and pay the annual interest income to his wife for the term of her natural life. After her death, he wills that the said £500 be divided as follows — £100 to his grandson Martin Harvey, son of his son William Harvey, £100 to the children of his daughter Elizabeth wife of Hannibal Cardell, share and share alike, £100 to his daughter Alice wife of Joseph Cardell, £100 to his daughter Wilmot Harvey, and £100 to his daughter Mary the wife of John Davey.

Gives to George Dennis John of the town of Penzance, gentleman, and to his son-in-law the said John Davey his freehold estate called Trevorgans in the parish of St. Buryan, in trust, for the benefit of his son William Harvey during his natural life. After William's death he wills the same to William's son, Martin Harvey and his heirs. In default of issue, he wills the same to William's son, William Harvey the younger and his heirs. In default of issue, he wills the same to William's son, John Harvey and his heirs. In default of issue, he wills the same to William's son, Edward Harvey and his heirs.

All the rest of his lands, tenements, goods, chattels, &c. he gives to his five children, William Harvey, Elizabeth Cardell, Alice Cardell, Wilmot Harvey and Mary Davey, as tenants in common but not joint tenants, appointing them coexecutors of his last will and testament.
