*The Will of John Headdon of the Parish of Marhamchurch in the County of Cornwall, Blacksmith, written 5 Mar 1711/2, inventory taken 28 Apr 1712.*

In the name of God Amen the fifth day of March one thousand seaven hundred & eleven I John Heddon of the parish of Marhamchurch and county of Cornwall, blak smith, being sick of body but of a sound & perfect disposing minde & memory thanks be to almighty God doe make and ordain this to be my last will and testament revoking all former wills by me made & is as followeth:

Imprimis: I give & bequeath my soul to almighty God my maker & my body to be buried in comely & decent manner according to the discretion of my executors here after named.

Item: I give & bequeath unto **my daughter Honour** twenty five pounds to be paid her within a half year after my decease.

Item: I give unto **my daughter Grace** twenty five pounds to be paid her within a half year after my decease & my will is that if she dye unmarried that fifteen pounds of the twenty five shall be paid unto **my son John** and the other ten pound of the twenty five shall be paid unto **my daughter Honour** at the time aforesaid.

Item: I give unto **my daughter Sidwell** one shilling.

Item: I give unto **my grand daughter Joan Rowland** twenty shillings to be paid her when she shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years.

Item: I give unto **my graund son Richard Rowland** five shillings to be paid when he shall accomplish the age of one & twenty years.

Item: I give unto **my graund son John Jewel** ten shillings to be paid him when he shall accomplish the age of one & twenty years.

Item: I give unto **my graund son Thomas Jewel** ten shillings to be paid him when he shall accomplish the age of one & twenty years.

Item: I give unto **my cosen Nicholas Heddon** one shilling.

Item: All the rest of my goods & chatels not given nor bequethed I give & bequeth unto **Joan my wife & John my sonn** whome I make & ordaine to be my executors joyntly & to see my will perfected. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fifth day of March 1711.
