The Will of Walter Heddon of the Parish of Marhamchurch in the County of Cornwall, written 19 Jan 1678/9, inventory taken 23 Apr 1679, will proved 19 Jun 1679.

In the name of God Amen I Walter Heddon of Marhamchurch being sick of body but perfect of sen-- and memory thanks be unto allmighty God doe make and ordanie this to be my last will and testament and is as followeth:

Imp: I give and bequeath my soule unto allmighty God my maker and redeemer and my body to the Christian buriall to be buried in comely & decent manner.

It: I give to **my daughter Jone** all the right and interest that I have in my estate in Whalesborough after the death of **my wife Honour**.

It: I give to **my daughter Elizabeth** tenn poundes that my will is **my daughter Jone** shall pay her within three months she enioyes the estate.

Item: I give to my daughter Elizabeth's daughter Margaret ten poundes that my will is my daughter Jone shall pay her when she shall acomplish the age of one and twenty yeares.

Item: I give to my daughter Elizabeth's daughter Susan twenty shillings that my will is my daughter Joane shall pay her when she shall accomplish the age of one and twenty yeares.

Item: I give unto **my daughter Joane's daughter Sidwell** twenty pounds that my will is my daughter Joane shall pay her when she shall acomplish the age of one and twenty yeares.

All the rest of my goods and chattells not given nor bequeathed I give and bequeath to **my wife Honour** whom I make my whole and full executrix and to see this my last will and testament performed. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seale this nineteenth day of Ja[nuary] one thousand six hundred seaventy eight.
