

Kresen Kernow (formerly Cornwall Record Office), Reference: AP/H/7466 W.

Abstract of the Will of Samuel Hill of the Parish of Wendron in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 13 Feb 1816, proved 21 May 1816.

Gives to **his wife Ann Hill** two rooms upstairs in his dwelling house, as well as two of the best beds, bedclothes and household furniture pertaining to the same, and his clock and watch.

Gives to **his son-in-law Peter Moyle** one eighth of the effects that **his wife Ann Hill** leaves at her decease. Also gives to him all his stock live and dead, and household furniture not in use by **his wife Ann Hill**.

Gives to **his grandson Walter Moyle** one eighth of the effects that **his wife Ann Hill** leaves at her decease.

The remainder of the effects that his wife will leave he gives to all his grandchildren, share and share alike, as well as to **Thomas the son of Elizabeth Penlerick**.

Gives £100 to **his grandson John Perry son of Peter Perry**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives £90 to **his grandson Samuel Moyle son of Peter Moyle**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives £45 to **his grandson John Moyle the son of Peter Moyle**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives £45 to **Thomas Hill son of Elizabeth Penlerick**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives £50 each to **his granddaughters Mary Perry and Ann Perry, daughters Peter Perry**, to be paid to them when they reach their respective ages of twenty-one years.

Gives £30 each to **his grandchildren Peter Moyle, William Moyle, James Moyle and Mary Moyle, sons and daughter of Peter Moyle**, to be paid to them when they reach their respective ages of twenty-one years.

Appoints **his wife Ann Hill** sole executrix of his last will and testament.

Nominates his friends **Thomas Hill and John Hill, sons of his brother Thomas Hill**, guardians and trustees of his grandchildren.
