*Abstract of the Will of Richard Hockin of the Parish of Gwithian in the County of Cornwall, Gentleman, written 29 Mar 1854, proved 26 Aug 1854.*

Gives to **his daughter Elizabeth the wife of Richard Rosewarne** of the parish of Phillack in co. Cornwall, schoolmaster, his freehold tenement in Connor Downs in Gwithian, currently occupied by Nicholas Christopher, independent of any husband. After her death, he gives the same to **her son John Rosewarne** and his heirs.

Gives £150 to **his son-in-law William Trerise** of the parish of Camborne in co. Cornwall, farmer, in trust, for **his daughter Alice the wife of John Rowe** the younger of Gwithian.

Gives to **his daughter Philippa the wife of** the said **William Trerise** his freehold tenement in Connor Downs, currently occupied by John Hosking and Elizabeth Williams. After her decease, he gives the same to her child or children.

Gives £100 to **his daughter Mary Hockin**, as well as one moiety of his leasehold tenement called Roscussow in the parish of St. Just in Roseland in co. Cornwall, now occupied by Thomas Rogers, having already settled the other moiety on **his daughter Jane Carbis**. After the death of his daughter Mary, he gives the said moiety to her child or children. He also gives to his daughter Mary all his household goods and furniture.

Gives £100 to **his daughter Jane Carbis**, in addition to what he has already settled on her.

Gives to **his son-in-law William Trerise** his freehold estate called Penance Vean in Gwithian, currently occupied by the testator, in trust, for the benefit of **his grandchildren**, namely **Richard, John and Mary Jane, children of his deceased son John Hockin**.

Gives an annuity of £20 to **his son William Hockin** for life.

All the rest of his lands and tenements, real and personal estate, he gives to **his son Charles Hockin** and his heirs. And if Charles should die without issue, then he gives his residuary estate to his said son William Hockin and said grandson Richard Hockin.

Appoints **his son Charles Hockin** sole executor of his will.
