Abstract of the Will of Haughton Hocking of the Parish of Camborne in the County of Cornwall, written 14 Apr 1735, proved 3 Jul 1735.*

* Name rendered as 'Hawton Hosking' by the writer, but signed by the testator as 'Haughton Hockin', which is how it is spelled on the wrapper.

Gives to **his brother Francis Hosking** a guinea of gold.

Gives to **his sister Honour Bennets** a guinea of gold.

Gives to **Nicholas the son of Nicholas Hosking** a guinea of gold.

Gives to **Hawton the son of Nicholas Hosking** a guinea of gold.

Gives to **John the son of Nicholas Hosking** a guinea of gold.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his wife** (not named) and **brother Nicholas Hosking**, whom he appoints co-executors of his will.
