

Kresen Kernow (formerly Cornwall Record Office), Reference: AP/H/6222 W, Inv.

Abstract of the Will of Richard Hocking of the Parish of Gwithian in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 25 Nov 1752, proved 2 Jan 1761.

Gives to **his son Richard Hocking** half of Hockings Tenement and Connarwartha which his said son now holds, half his right in Garrick in Gwithian, and half of the Thorns or Spray.

Gives to **his daughter Margaret** all his right and title in the estate New Mills Meadows & Downs in this parish which were formerly held by her husband, along with a guinea of gold.

Gives one guinea to **his daughter Elizabeth**, her inheritance having already been paid to her.

Gives to **his son John Hocking** the bed and furniture in the great chamber.

Gives 2 shillings sixpence to each of his grandchildren.

All the rest of his goods, chattels & effects he gives to his **two younger sons, Charles Hocking and John Hockin**, appointing them co-executors of his last will and testament.
