Gives £10 to his servant Edward Craker.

Gives and devises to his son-in-law Arthur Kempe of Gerrans, gent. and to Philip Hawkins of Penance in Cornwall, gent., all his lands, tenements and hereditaments in trust to raise and to pay his two daughters Elizabeth and Ursula £1,000 each, the remainder to be equally divided between his three daughters Honor Kempe, Elizabeth Huddy and Ursula Huddy.

Appoints the said Philip Hawkins and **Arthur Kempe** co-executors of his last will and testament, to whom he each gives a mourning ring.

Gives £10 to his sister-in-law Elizabeth Huddy to buy mourning.
