Abstract of the Will of Penelope Hutchens of the Parish of Paul in the County of Cornwall, Widow, written 9 Oct 1718, proved 3 Aug 1725.

Gives to **her daughter-in-law Joan Hutchens** 27 silver shillings or the equivalent in gold.

Gives £50 to **her granddaughter Penelope Hutchens**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one or within a month after her marriage, whichever happens first.

Gives £50 to **her granddaughter Margerett Hutchens**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one or within a month after her marriage, whichever happens first.

Gives £50 to **her granddaughter Mary Hutchens**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one or within a month after her marriage, whichever happens first.

Gives £50 to **her granddaughter Julian Hutchens**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one or within a month after her marriage, whichever happens first.

Gives £50 to **her granddaughter Ruth Hutchens**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one or within a month after her marriage, whichever happens first.

Gives to **her son-in-law Martin Bodinar**, merchant, and to **his wife Mary Bodinar her daughter**, 27 shillings each or the equivalent in gold.

Gives £10 each to her grandchildren Stephen Bodinar, Thomas Bodinar and Ruth Bodinar, sons and daughter of the said Martin and Mary Bodinar.

Gives 50 shillings to Peregrine Cornwall (the Black).

Gives 50 shillings to the poor of the parish of Paul.

Gives to Margerett Pendarves daughter of Henry Pendarves of Paul, Gent. 27 shillings or the equivalent in gold.

Gives a half guinea of gold each to her executors to buy them mourning rings.

Gives to **her daughter-in-law Joan Hutchens** all her goods and chattels, real and personal estate, trusting and desiring her to distribute them among her daughters by her son Arthur Hutchens, according to her discretion.

Appoints the said Joan Hutchens, Mary Bodinar, James Keigwin, Esq., Henry Pendarves and John Boson, Gent. co-executors of her last will and testament.
