*The Will of Walter Jeffery of the Parish of Gwennap in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 6 May 1691, inventory taken 19 Mar 1691/2, will proved 13 Oct 1692.*

In the name of God Amen I Walter Jeffery of the Parrish of Gwinnap in the County of Cornwall yeoman beinge Weake in Body, but of sound and perfect memmory Laude and praise be to Allmighty God Doe make and ordaine this my last Will and Testament in manner and Forme Followinge.

First I Bequeath my Soule into the hands of Allmighty God &c...

Item. I bequeath my Body to be Buried in Christian Buriall Att the Discretion of my Executors hereafter nominated.

Item. I give unto **my Daughter Katherine** one shilling.

Item. I give unto **Julian my Daughter** Forty shillings.

Item. I give unto **my Daughter Mary** one shilling.

Item. I give unto **Constance my deere wife** the sum of eight pounds yearly to be paied Quarterly out of my Estate by my Executors duringe her naturall life if **Nicholas Jeffery my Sonn** happen to live so longe.

Item. All the Rest of my Goods, Howses and Chattles not yet given and bequeathed I doe give and bequeath unto **my two Sonns Nicholas Jeffery and John Jeffery** whome I do Constitute and Appoint to be my full and sole Executors to see this my Will performed And to pay all my Debts and Legassies. And for all Former Wills and Testaments I doe Utterlie Renounce Revoak and make null and voidd by Vertue of These Presents. In Witness whereof I the said Walter Jeffery have hereunto set my hand and Seale geaven the Sixth day of May Anno Domini: 1691.
