

Abstract of the Will of John Keigwin of Mousehole in the Parish of Paul and County of Cornwall, written 19 Jun 1693, proved 12 Mar 1693/4.

Gives £200 to **his son Richard**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-five.

Gives £200 to **his son Roger**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-two.

Gives £200 to **his son John**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-two.

Gives £200 to **his daughter Margaret**. And whereas Margaret was bequeathed £50 in the will of **her aunt Catherine Gifford** of which amount he has received £35 from Leonard Yeo of Devon, Esq^r, in lieu of this amount he gives Margaret £100.

Gives £200 to **his daughter Prudence**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one.

Gives £240 to **his daughter Joan**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one.

Gives £200 to **his daughter Elizabeth**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one.

Gives £200 to **his daughter Anne**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one.

Gives to **his mother** a gold ring worth 10 shillings.

Gives 10 shillings to Sampson Hutchens to buy him a ring.

Gives 10 shillings to the poor of the parish of Huish.

Gives to John Wills his best broadcloth black suit with his sword and belt.

Gives to his servant Jo: Hugh the rest of his clothing and 5 shillings.

Gives 5 shillings each to his other servants.

Gives 8 guineas of gold to **his wife Margaret**, along with all his gold now in her possession and £20 in silver.

Gives £2 to the poor of the parish of Paul.

Appoints his friends **James Prade** [Praed] of Trevethow, Esq^r, Edward Penros of Penros, Esq^r, John Burlace of Pendeen, Gent, Capt. Robert Yeo of Huish and Thomas Hawkins of Helston, Gent. co-executors of his last will and testament.
