Gives and bequeaths £100 to his second son Richard Lanyon.

Gives and bequeaths 5 guineas to his grandson Richard Lanyon the son of his son Richard Lanyon.

Gives and bequeaths £200 to his daughter Anne Lanyon.

Gives and bequeaths £80 to his son Hugh Lanyon.

Gives and bequeaths £150 to his daughter Mary Lanyon.

All the rest, residue and remainder of his goods, chattels, monies, securities for money, property and effects he gives and bequeaths to **his sons William Lanyon** and **John Lanyon** whom he appoints co-executors and residuary legatees of his last will and testament.
