*The Will of Nowell Michell alias Angove of the Parish of Gwinear in the County of Cornwall, written 19 Feb 1630/1, proved: 27 Dec 1632.*

(Paragraphed for easier reading)

I Nowell Michell *a/s.* Angove being aged & weak in body but perfit in memorie & understandinge thanks be given to Almightye god, doe make my last Will & Testament in manner & forme followinge

First I bequeath my soule in to the hands of Jesus Christ & my body to be buried in Christian buriall.

Imprimis I give to the poore of the p'ish of Gwiniar v<sup>s</sup> to be delivered by the mynister & overseers amongst those that be impodent & in greatest need.

It. I give unto **Arthur my Sonne** xii<sup>d</sup> & to his children vi<sup>d</sup> apiece.

It. to **William my Sonne** xii<sup>d</sup> & to his children vi<sup>d</sup> apiece.

It. to **John my Sonne** xii<sup>d</sup> & to his children vi<sup>d</sup> apiece.

It. to **Henry my Sonne** xii<sup>d</sup>.

It. to **Elizabeth Verran my daughter** xii<sup>d</sup> & to her children vi<sup>d</sup> apiece

It. to **the children of Bennat Rosewarne** vi<sup>d</sup> apiece.

It. to **Anne Michell my daughter** I give xii<sup>d</sup>.

It. [to] **Margaret my daughter** xii<sup>d</sup>.

It. I give to **my daughter Margery** xii<sup>d</sup>.

It. for tythes forgotten iii<sup>s</sup> 4<sup>d</sup>.

The rest of my goods I give & bequeath unto **Amie my wife** whome I make my whole executrix.

. . . . . as I stand possessed of one chattell lease wheare in now I dwell . . . . . I hould of the . . . . . of Sr. William Godolphin knight for fower score & nynteene yeares if **Amy my wife, Arthur & William my sonnes** so longe shall live I doe by this my last Will & testament I give this lease unto Amie my wife & unto her assigns during the lives . . . . .

. . . . . in witness where of I have set my hand & seal the day & yeare above written & doe revoke all former willes.

A true Inventory of all the goods & chattels of Nowell Mitchell of the p'ishe of Gwynyar late deceased was praised by Thomas Michell & Wm. Penwearen xxii<sup>th</sup> of May 1632 [totalling] £46 xviii<sup>s</sup>. viii<sup>d</sup>.
