*Abstract of the Will of Richard Nicholls of the Parish of Phillack in the County of Cornwall, Gentleman, written 10 Jun 1815, proved 9 May 1818.*

Gives £150 each to **his daughters Elizabeth Nicholls and Mary Jenkin**, widow.

Gives £20 to **his grandson Nicholas Tredinnick**.

Gives £40 to **his grandson Thomas Tredinnick**.

Gives £10 to **his grandson Richard Tredinnick**.

Gives £10 to **his granddaughter Constance Tredinnick**.

Gives £10 to **his granddaughter Elizabeth the wife of Moses Symons**.

Gives £30 to **his grandson William Jenkin**.

Gives £20 to **his granddaughter Elizabeth Nicholls Jenkin**.

Gives £10 each to **his sisters Margery Glanvill and Alice Sickler**.

Directs that an amount of £5 be divided among the poor widows of Phillack by his friends Roger Vivian and Richard Glanvill, clerks of the Cornish Copper Company.

Gives all his furniture and books to **his daughter Elizabeth**.

Gives to the said Roger Vivian and Richard Glanvill his freehold and undivided third parts in and of Treglissen and Laity in the parish of Phillack, in trust, for the use of **his son Gregory Nicholls**. After the death of his son Gregory he gives the same to **his grandson Richard Nicholls** and his heirs male. In default of issue, he gives the same to **his grandson Gregory Nicholls** the younger and his heirs.

Gives all his leasehold undivided two thirds of and in Treglissen and Laity to his son Gregory Nicholls for life.

Gives his freehold tenement in Chycoll in the parish of Saint Creed to his son Gregory Nicholls for life.

All the rest of his goods, chattels, rights and credits he gives to his son Gregory Nicholls, whom he appoints sole executor of his will.
