Gives to **his son Thomas Paul** his stamping mill and the lease of three fields belonging to them, conditional that Thomas pays £10 to his executrix within a year of his death.

Gives to **his son Robert Paul** 1/32 part in an adventure in Wheal Cocke copper mine, forgiving him all his debts.

Gives £10 to his daughter Mary Paul and 1/32 part in an adventure in Wheal Cocke copper mine.

Gives to his daughter Elianor the wife of James Banfield 1/32 part in an adventure in Wheal Cocke copper mine.

Gives to **his son William Paull** 1/32 part in an adventure in Wheal Cocke copper mine, and his best suit of clothes, linnen or wool.

Gives £10 to **his son Walter Paul** and the premises called Bussows Moor and stamping mill.

Gives guinea of gold each to his grandchildren Nicholas Paul, Walter Paul, Mary Banfield, Martha Banfield and Elizabeth Banfield.

Gives £5 to **his son Bartholomew Paul** and 1/32 part in an adventure in Wheal Cocke copper mine.

Gives £10 to his daughter Jane Paul.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his wife Elianor Paul**, appointing her sole executrix of his last will and testament.
