

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers,
PROB 11/625/236.

Abstract of the Will of Jone Pender of the Town of Penzance in the County of Cornwall, Milliner, written 18 Dec 1727, proved 26 Oct 1728.

Gives to **her brother Oliver Pendar** of Newlyn, merchant, her dwelling house, orchards and gardens in Penzance of which she has the inheritance or fee simple. After his death the same shall descend to **her nephew Christopher Pendar** and his heirs male.

Gives 10 guineas in gold to **her nephew John Pendar, the eldest son of her brother Oliver Pendar**.

Gives £50 to **her nephew Christopher Lobb***, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives to her said **nephew Christopher Pendar** all her shop goods and shop credits, directing him to pay out of the same £50 each to **his two sisters Margaret and Ann**.

Gives black cloth to **her cousin Jenkins wife of James Jenkins** of Alverne, Gent.

Gives £100 to her said nephew Christopher Pendar, as well as her chattel estate in the dwelling house and garden where she now lives.

Appoints William Ustick of Gent, the said Christopher Pendar and the said James Jenkins co-executors and trustees of her last will and testament.

All the rest she gives to the said Christopher Pendar and his two sisters, share and share alike.
