Gives £5 7s. 6d. to his servant Henry Newton, along with his white nagg, saddle and bridle.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to his cousin William Pendarves, son of his late uncle Thomas Pendarves, appointing him sole executor of his last will and testament.

Nominates **his aunt Grace Pendarves, widow**, and John Cocke of Redruth, Gent. as overseers of his will and executors in trust during the minority of the said William Pendarves.
