

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers, PROB 11/480/447.

*Abstract of the Will of Thomas Pendarves, Rector of the Parish of Columb Major in the County of Cornwall, written 12 Apr 1703, proved 26 Feb 1704/5.*

Gives £6 to the poor of the parishes of St. Columb and Mawgan.

Gives £550 to **his wife Grace** in accordance with the marriage bond paid to **his wife's brother Richard Hoblyn**, Esq. He also gives her his new house and garden in the town of St. Columb for the term of her natural life.

Gives £500 to **his daughter Grace Pendarves**, to be paid to her at the age of twenty-one or the day of her marriage. Further, he wills an additional £300 to her if **his nephew Richard Pendarves** dies.

All the rest of his lands, tenements, goods & chattels he gives to **his son William Pendarves** and his heirs, appointing him sole executor of his last will and testament.

Nominates as trustees and overseers his friends and **kinsmen Robert Hoblyn** of Nanswhedon, clerk, **John Williams** of Trehane, Esq., **Hugh Bawden** of Guthene?, Gent., **Thomas Hoblyn** of Tresaderne, Gent. and his wife during her widowhood, as guardians of his children during their minorities.

Gives £100 to **his sister Hickes** if living.

Gives £100 to **his sister Courtney** if still living, and if deceased, to his niece Catherine Williams wife of John Williams, Esq.

Gives £100 to **his cousin Hugh Bawden and his sister Catherine Coode**, to be equally divided between them.
