

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers, PROB 11/217/586.

Abstract of the Will of James Praed of Trevethowa (in the Parish of Lelant) in the County of Cornwall, Esquire, written 26 Aug 1650, proved 8 Jul 1651.

Gives £3 to the poor of the parish of Uny Lelant.

Gives 40 shillings to the poor of the parish of St. Ives.

Gives to his servants John White and John Wallish 20 shillings each.

Gives to his servant Dorcas Fowler a three-year-old heifer.

Gives £13 6s. 8d. to **his cousin Robert Pawly**, Gent.

Gives £100 to **his daughter Prudence Keigwin**.

Gives £200 to **his daughter Katherin Hammond**.

Gives £300 to **his daughter Prideaux**, widow.

Gives £500 to **his daughter Ann**.

Gives £500 to **his daughter Marie**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one or marries.

Wills that **his daughter Honnor Prideaux**, widow, her children and servants, lodge at Trevethowa with his son for two years, if his daughter thinks fit.

Gives an annuity of £20 to **his daughter Jane**.

Gives £5 each to his grandchildren.

The rest of his goods and chattels, real and personal estate, he gives to **his son James Praed** and his heirs, appointing him executor of his last will and testament.
