Gives £5 to his daughter Catharine.

Gives £5 to his daughter Frances.

Gives £5 to his daughter Mary.

Gives £5 to his daughter Joan.

Gives £5 to his son John.

All the rest of his lands and tenements, goods and chattels, rights and credits, he gives and bequeaths to Tobias Roberts, gent., and to **Joseph Pryor his brother**, in trust, for the benefit of **his son Samuel** until he reaches the age of twenty-one years.
