Abstract of the Will of Paul Quick of the Parish of Towednack in the County of Cornwall, written 2 Aug 1710, proved 5 Oct 1710.

Gives to **his wife Jane Quick** a feather bed with its furniture and that estate her life is upon in Trevisa Worthaw (Trevessa Wartha).

Gives to **his daughter Jane**, then underage, his tenement in the parish of St. Ives called the Drysack.

Gives to **his daughters Elizabeth and Ann**, both underage, his two tenements in Zennor called Foage and Carn.

Gives to **his son James** his estate in the Earl of Radnor's land called Trevisa Werlapp?, when he comes of age.

Gives £30 to **his son Israel**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives to **his son John** the tenement of Beagle Tubbon? when he turns twenty-one and provided his brother Paul surrenders his right to it; otherwise, he gives to John the estate he now lives on, being the land of John Prade, Esq^r.

Appoints **his son Paul** sole executor of his will, giving him the rest of his goods and chattels, obliging him to take his sister Jane's right to Beagle Tubbor.

Appoints **James Quick** of Zennor, **his brother**, **Thomas Quick** of St. Ives, **his kinsman**, and John Stephens of St. Ives, merchant, trustees.
