Abstract of the Will of Thomas Rosewall the Elder of Trowan in the Borough and Parish of St. Ives in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 29 Apr 1784, proved 18 May 1787.

Gives to his son James Rosewall his part and right in the estate of Trevalgan.

Confirms a bequest to **his son Thomas Rosewall** of his estate in Merther in Towednack Church Town, which he settled on him by Deed of Gift.

Gives an annuity of £10 to **his son William Rosewall**, payable out of his estate at Buzzo, during his natural life.

Gives an annuity of £10 to **his son George Rosewall**, payable out of his estate at Buzzo, during his natural life.

Gives an annuity of £10 to **his son Andrew Rosewall**, payable out of his estate at Buzzo, to be payable when he turns twenty-one and thereafter during his natural life.

Gives an annuity of £10 to **his son John Rosewall**, payable out of his estate at Rosewall in the parish of Towednack, during his natural life.

Gives one guinea to his sister Catherine Bennet.

Gives to **his wife Elizabeth Rosewall** his estate at Buzzo subject to the payment of the above annuities, his house at Trowan where he lives, and his tin bounds and tin works.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his wife Elizabeth Rosewall**, appointing her sole executrix of his last will and testament.
