

Kresen Kernow (formerly Cornwall Record Office), Reference: AP/R/3964 W.

*Abstract of the Will of John Rosewarne of the Parish of Gwinear in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 22 Nov 1819, proved 10 Jun 1820.*

Gives to his wife a yearly rent charge of £10, to be paid out of his estate of Bosparva.

Gives to **his son John** his estate and premises called Trembleth in the parish of St. Ervan in co. Cornwall.

Gives to **his son William** his freehold estate of Carnhell, except the little meadow between Jennings House and the Malt House garden.

Gives £150 to **his daughter Phillis**, payable out of his estate of Trenawin in Gwinear, along with the further sum of £150 payable out of his freehold estate of Carnhell.

Gives to **his daughter Elizabeth the wife of Captain John Vivian**, his right, title and share in the Good Brigg Rosewarne, as well as his title and interest in his tenement and premises called Trenawin, she paying to her sister Phillis the said amount of £150, once she turns twenty-one.

Gives to **his son Henry** the malt house, dwelling house, garden and premises in Carnhell currently occupied by Thomas Hockin, as well as the dwelling house, gardens and premises in the possession of Thomas Jennings and John Hambly, and the aforesaid little meadow currently held by Henry's brother William. Also gives to Henry half his share in Lambe? copper mine.

All the rest of his goods, chattels, lands and tenements he gives to **his wife Margaret, his son Henry and his son-in-law Captain John Vivian**, in trust, for **his sons Pearce and Richard**, share and share alike, as tenants in common.

Appoints his sons Pearce and Richard co-executors of his will.
