Abstract of the Will of Arthur Spry of Place in the Parish of St. Anthony in Roseland and the County Cornwall, written 26 Jan 1683/4, proved 5 Oct 1685.

Gives £10 to his wife Luce Spry to buy her mourning.

Gives £3 10s. each to his children George Spry and his wife, Arthur, William & Luce Spry, Mary Kemp, Elizabeth Porter and Ann Haws, to buy mourning.

Gives £3 10s. to Mrs. Dorothy Nance to buy mourning.

Gives 50 shillings each to his brother Samwell Spry, and his (sons-in-law) John Nance, Nicholas Kemp, Christopher Porter and John Haws.

Gives 20 shillings to each of John Nance's children.

Gives to **his son George** all the goods and furniture in the two chambers occupied by his wife and her maids.

Gives to **his son Arthur** all the books he bought from Mr. Porter except the great Bible which he returns to Mr. Porter.

Gives to **his son William** all his estate with term of years in Hendersick *alias* Hendresick, or £1000.

Gives £1000 to his daughter Luce Spry.

Gives an annuity of £6 to Elizabeth Porter.

Gives 20 shillings a year for life to **his sister Ann Ward**. He gives to **Ann's son George Ward**, £5, and **daughters Mary Trewin** & **Ann Roberts**, 20 shillings each.

Gives 10 shillings each to Mary wife of John Bennet and her children.

Gives 10 shillings each to the children of **his nephew George Spry**, deceased, to buy them each a silver spoon.

Gives 5 shillings to each of his servants, and 20 shillings to Florence Trewin.

Gives £5 to the poor of St. Anthony.

Gives an annuity of £12 to his brother Samwell Spry.

All the rest of his goods, chattel estates, tinworks and bounds he gives to **his sons George, Arthur and William**, to be divided equally between them, and appoints them co-executors of his last will and testament.
