All the rest of her household goods and furniture, along with her undivided third part in leasehold premises at Tolpons and Porthleven in the parish of Sithney now occupied by John Pascoe, Thomas Jacka, Solomon Rowe and the said **Thomas Stodden**, she gives to the said **Edward Freeman** upon trust, to sell the remainder of her household goods and pay the interest from her leasehold premises to **her son Thomas Stodden** and **grandson Thomas Freeman**.

Appoints the said **Edward Freeman** executor in trust of her last will and testament.
