Abstract of the Will of Bennet Trelowar (Treloar) of the Parish of Wendron in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 23 Dec 1760, proved 18 May 1762.

Gives 10 shillings each to his son Bennet Trelowar and his daughters Ann the wife of James Tyack and Rebecca Lanyon, widow.

Gives £2 2s. each to his sons Daniel and Benjamin.

Gives £2 2s. to his daughter Mary.

Gives to his son Bennet his share in Treneere tin bounds in the parish of Wendron.

Gives to **his son John Trelowar** his tenement in Higher Trenethick in Wendron. Remits all rent owed to him by John on the same.

Gives to **his son Thomas Trelowar** his leasehold estate in Lower Trelubbra in Wendron, along with his household goods, cattle, to receive the profits during the lease, after which he divides the same between **his sons Thomas**, **William**, **James** and **Henry**.

Makes his son Thomas responsible for the education and maintenance of his said son Benjamin, then a minor.

Gives to **his wife Joan Trelowar**, **mother of Benjamin**, an annuity of £4, to be paid out of his estate in Lower Trelubbra.

All the rest of lands, tenements, goods & chattels he gives to **his son Thomas Trelowar**, appointing him sole executor of his will.

Bennet Treloar married twice in Wendron, first to Ann Pascoe on 18 Apr 1721 (Ann was buried on 21 Feb 1750/1 in Wendron), and second, to Joan Grigg on 19 Jun 1755.
